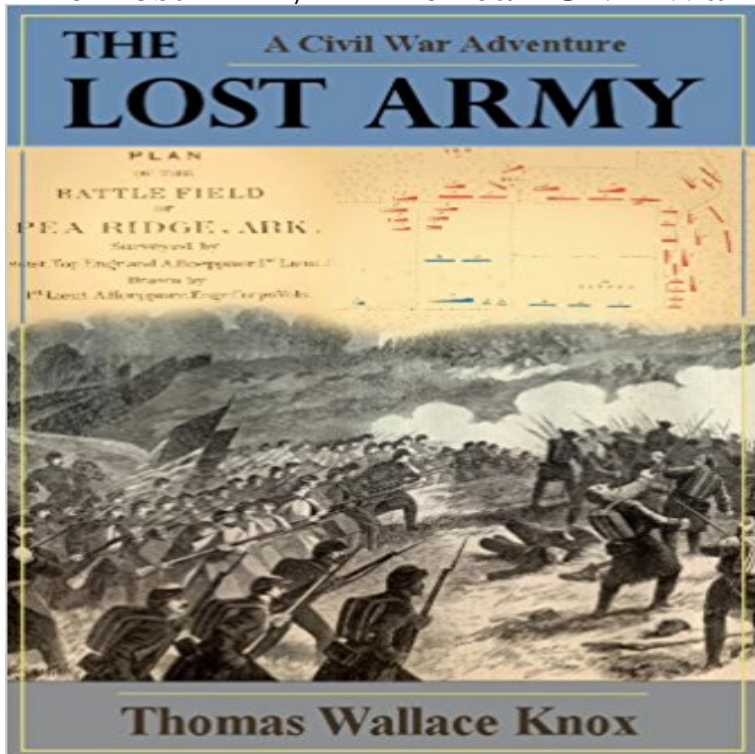


## The Lost Army - American Civil War [linked table of contents]
