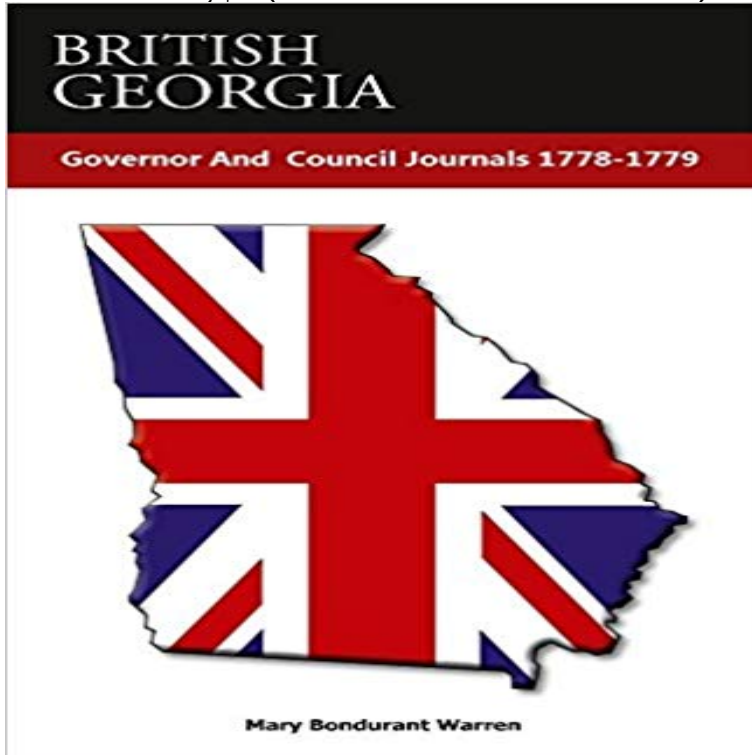

BRITISH GEORGIA, Governor and Council Journals 1778-1779 Savannah Under Siege The Revolution wasn't turning out as predicted. Many who were early supporters saw its promises unfulfilled. Some longed for the return of a stable British government. Revenge and pay back was rampant, particularly in the county Committees of Safety, as they banished local landowners with no appeal! Georgia's former Governor and Counselors were in exile, but the British military commanders were planning to retrieve the colony. In a surprise attack in late Dec. 1778, Georgia was taken away from the Rebels. By July 1779 the British Governor and Council were back in Savannah, struggling to reestablish law and order with the aid of a Hessian garrison, a few British troops, and local militia. A September hurricane at Savannah disabled Count D'Estaing's fleet returning to France from the Caribbean. With some 5,000 troops on board, and lengthy repairs needed, the French command decided to attack Savannah. Gaining some troops from the Rebels who held Charleston, the siege of Savannah began. Follow the life-and-death struggle to its conclusion.
